WINTER COUGHS AND COLDS

At this time of year there are lots of bugs and germs about. Here are some reminders to try and minimise the spread of germs to prevent outbreaks.

Diarrhoea and Vomiting: children must not return to school for 48 hours after the last symptoms.



Respiratory infections including Covid-19: children should not attend school if they have a high temperature or are unwell to avoid passing on any infection to others. Swimming: good standards of personal hygiene must be maintained at the swimming pool at all times. The Isle of Man Swimming Guidelines state that children suffering from the following should not be permitted to swim: colds, coughs, sore throats, and nasal catarrh. If children are not well enough to attend swimming we would like to politely request that they stay at home until they are better as this will prevent infection being passed onto others.

Did you know that last week was the first ever Isle of Man Children and Adult's Safeguarding week? The Isle of Man Safeguarding Board held a range of training for anyone to access and staff at SyJ attended several courses during the week.

Safeguarding is all of our responsibility and as a member of the public then it is your duty to report any concerns that you have about a child or a family directly to Children and Families Division or the Police. 'Doing nothing is not an option.'
