World Book Day - A message from Ms Westcott

World Book Day this year is to be held on Friday 8th March 2024 at Scoill yn Jubilee. We always celebrate World Book Day at Jubilee the day after the actual advertised day due to the swimming timetable. The theme for this years world book week is: Reading for Pleasure. Children can come dressed up as their favourite book character, but please be aware that children must still wear sensible shoes and a warm waterproof clothing for break times on this day.

We organise a list of events during that week that lead up to the day itself. Some of these activities we hope you will be able to support and participate in as parent / carer helpers. We will let you know nearer the time what we would like you to get involved with.

Picking suitable books for your child: World Book Day's aim this year is for books to be for all children and their families, and particularly to offer a gateway into reading for those who don't currently see themselves as readers. We recognise that reading for pleasure develops at different times for all children – and that children who are less engaged in reading are likely to have a reading level lower than their chronological age. We are also aware that some children develop their reading skills at a rate that exceeds their emotional development. Please be aware that most of the books listed as being suitable for independent readers in the lists on the website below will include content that is not emotionally suitable for a young person under the age of 11 and some will be intended for an older teen. Please do use these lists to help guide yourself and your child when looking for fresh reading material. We suggest that these lists are shared between an adult and a child and titles chosen that match both their reading and their chronological age.
